In response to YCI staff requests, **A SACRED PLACE** has provided course books, journals, and creative activities such as inspirational art materials to keep the women uplifted and hopeful. Throughout the next weeks, and possibly months, our volunteers will continue providing resources and support to the staff and to the women at York.

### The Story Behind Our Storybook Program

IN THE EARLY 1990'S, Lutheran Social Services in Chicago founded a program called **STORY-BOOK PROJECT**, which has been adopted nationwide to help children stay connected to their incarcerated moms (and dads in some states). Through Storybook Project, incarcerated parents choose a donated book; volunteers record parents reading books aloud to their children, then mail the books and CD recordings to the children.

STORYBOOK PROJECT was introduced to York Correctional Institution over 20 years ago by Ann Johnson and Dianne Warley, through a grant from the Episcopal Diocese of Connecticut. Dianne's brother, Robert C. Goodwin, upon his death, designated gifts in his memory to be given to Storybook Project, which he wholeheartedly supported.

Today at York CI, volunteers of A Sacred Place record mothers reading books to their children and encourage them to end with a special message of love and support. A package with the book and the CD recording is mailed to the children for them to keep, and for reading along and listening to their mother, again and again. Studies have shown that hearing their mother's voice helps children maintain a bond with their incarcerated parent, and contributes to successful family integration upon release.

In 2018, after working diligently with the staff at York CI, **A Sacred Place** ensured the continued success of this program by implementing updated technology to provide the end product: the voice of a mom reading a book to her child.



The use of cassette tapes and tape recorders transitioned to digital recorders, a small computer, and a CD burner. Our goal to provide a program which seeks to bond incarcerated mothers and their children, has been realized with results that are gratifying and affirming.

Since 2018, the volunteers of A Sacred Place have facilitated the recording and mailing of 545 books and CDs!

As a program under the umbrella of **A Sacred Place**, STORYBOOK PROJECT relies on donated books and monetary gifts to replenish the collection of treasured children's stories.
